A RideStaffs cycling event in Stone on Sept 29th 2019

Background

RideStaffs has been delivering sportive events (non-competitive cycling challenges) in Staffordshire since 2013, including the Staffordshire Cycling Festival, Staffordshire's biggest single day cycling event.

Since 2015 RideStaffs has been organising a ride in conjunction with Lymestone Brewery to mark the end of the cycling season. The ride has been known to date as the Lymestone Cowboy ride.

With the number of riders wishing to participate in the event now exceeding the capacity of the venue at the brewery, we would like to explore the idea of bringing the event into Stone town and using the top of the high street as our start/finish area, bringing additional footfall to the town on an otherwise quiet autumn Sunday.

What we're asking for

In order to bring the event into the town we're asking for Stone Town Council to provide the necessary permissions and road closures to be granted to enable us to create our start/finish area in the space at the north end of the High Street.

How would this work?

With a closure in place on the High Street from midnight on the day of the event. We would propose to operate according to the following basic schedule:

- 0600 Arrive on site, drop off of crowd barriers to demarcate start/finish funnel.
- 0700 Registration (likely at Bear Coffee) open.
- 0830 First riders depart
- 1130 First Rider Finish
- 1530 Cut off time for finish.
- 1600 Barrier collection begins
- 1700 Site clear.

How is the site managed?

We use experienced stewards to manage the flow of riders away from the event start and to advise any vehicles seeking to enter the High Street of the closure during the event period.

What will it look like on the ground?

Our proposed layout for the site looks like this, the illustration below is an image of our event in Uttoxeter, a similar pedestrianised high street with closure to facilitate our event.
